"Kelsey drew up custom built-ins for that room, and we painted it a beautiful color from Benjamin Moore called Boudoir," explains James. "I'll never forget watching as Leigh-An walked into the living room for the first time and stood there for a while. Wes wrapped his arms around her and said, 'What are you thinking?' She was crying and said, 'My house is so beautiful. I just can't believe how beautiful it is!' And that makes it all worth it."
