


Decorating Tips with WILL WICK

"I'm currently restoring a Creole cottage in New Orleans' French Quarter by taking it back to its original condition with slight updates to the kitchen and baths. There weren't bathrooms when [the cottage] was built in 1820, rather outhouses and pots under the bed. The kitchens were outdoors with large fireplaces, so clearly that wouldn't work. The cottage is very close to Lenny Kravitz's old home in the Quarter so we are designing a 'Lenny Lounge' for late-night affairs."

"I'm dying to start playing more with brass for cabinetry in kitchens and baths. Also mixing marbles and creating patterns with marbles on floors and countertops."



"I recently put lowlight strip lighting under the toe kick in a bathroom that is switched on with a motion sensor. So when going to the bathroom at night, the homeowner doesn't have to find the light switch and has just enough light to see where he or she is going."
