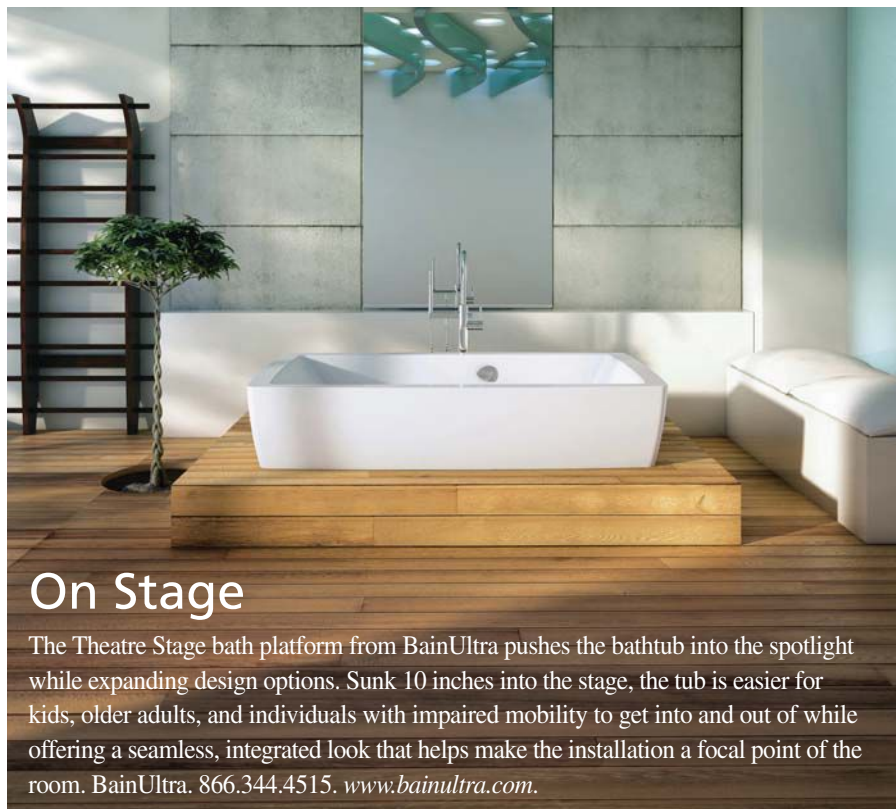

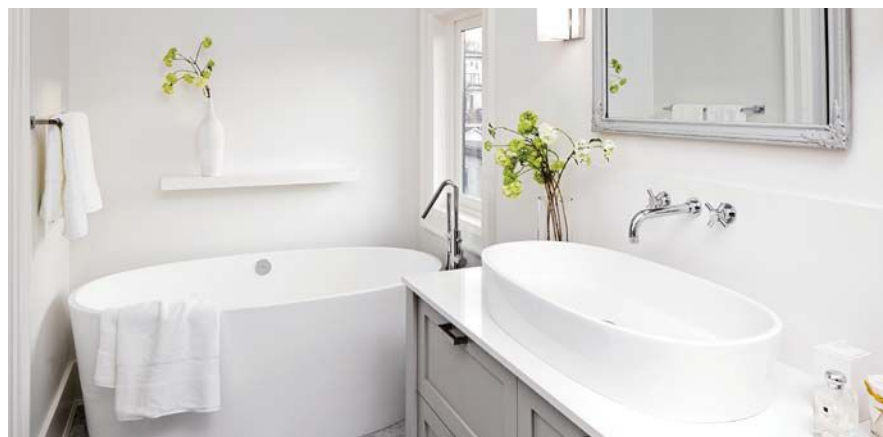
Global Structure
