The Frank Lloyd Wright Foundation's Taliesin drawer pulls echo the organic materials and graceful geometry of their namesake, the architect's Wisconsin studio. The fixtures pair anodized aluminum with, from bottom, walnut, stainless steel, beech, and oil-rubbed bronze; custom versions are offered. SPIN CYCLE

Its retro looks and compact size allow the Bianca Direcional ceiling fan to adapt to any space; the blades can be manuevered along a 180-degree arc, directing airflow where it's needed. The Y-shaped fan has mahogany blades and comes in multiple finishes, including polished copper, shown. A caged fan with metal blades, ideal for lower ceilings, is also offered.
