Spa Technology

Electronics like remote-controlled TV, stereo or windows that work at the touch of a button make bath time more fun.

Hydrotherapy tubs include three key components: heat, buoyancy, and massage. Heat speeds up the removal of lactic acid from sore muscles. Muscles heated in warm bath water are less fatigued and recover faster. Buoyancy is an upward force exerted by a liquid, gas or other fluid that opposes the weight of an immersed object. Buoyancy in your tub relieves pressure on the body, tissues and muscles. Massage is the manipulation of superficial and deeper layers of muscle and connective tissue to enhance function, aid in the healing process and promote overall relaxation and well-being.

According to Jacuzzi, a long-time industry leader, hydrotherapy can be used to treat stress in the mind and body, specifically treating ailments like arthritis, restless leg syndrome and insomnia, not to mention daily stress. Several options offering hydrotherapy are available to consumers. Jacuzzi options include the legendary Whirlpool, delivering a therapeutic, invigorating massage.
