The IIDA/HD Best Product Awards

Many products on display at Hospitality Design Expo (HD Expo) are vying to win one of the eight categories of the 12th annual IIDA/HD Product Design Competition.

This year's judges are Brian G. Thornton, IIDA, AIA.

Brian G Thornton Design; Cheryl Durst, Hon. IIDA, LEED AF, Executive Vice President and CEO IIDA; Bellinda Bennett, IIDA, the Bennett Design Group; Viveca Bissonnette, IIDA, CarrierJohnson; and Conrad Bonet, IIDA, Bonet & Associates International LLC. Categories include: applied finishes and materials (wallcoverings and paints); textiles (upholstery and bedspread/drapery/casement flabrics); flooring (carpet, hard surface, and resilient flooring); lighting (individual and group); accessories or speciatiles (artwork, hardware, storage systems, and miscellaneous); individual seating (dining, lounge, and outdoor); casegoods and freestanding furniture (individual furnishings and groups/collections); and group seating (dining, lounge, and outdoor).

Last year the coveted "best of competition" went to the Shaw Hospitality Group for After Images. Other winners included Oracle by Weltzner; Cabana Club Collection by Tropitone; Elite Backlit Mirror by Electric Mirror; the Evo System by Vantage Point; Bridge Single Hold Lavatory Faucet with Radius Technology by Waterdecor; Convergence by Milliken Hospitality; Vibe Collection by Carnegie; and the Kimono Collection by Designtex.

The judges arrive early on Wednesday morning to whittle down the large selection to between five and 20 products. They make their final decisions today through in-person visits to the manufacturers on the show floor. The competition ends this afternoon wher the awards are given out on the show floor. Winners of each sub-category and "best of competition" will be announced (along with the judges' comments) at the Platinum Circle Gala this evening; winners will also be showcased in tomorrow's Show Daily.
