
That's exactly what homeowners Todd and Diane Halbur said about updating their suburban kitchen. Surfing the Web for tips on sanding and painting cabinetry, refinishing countertops, and cutting and installing tile helped the amateur do-it-yourselfers, including sons Jack and Ben, achieve an elegant upgrade for their U-shape kitchen.

The Halburs worked with *Kitchen* + *Bath Makeovers*™ to refresh what they called the

"1990s country" style of their home. Hoping
to go more contemporary—but not *too*contemporary, they were quick to caution—we
focused on traditional colors and textures in
modern applications. Although it seemed dark
in the paint can, the sagey gray on the cabinetry
is brightened by the kitchen's ample natural
