As these little bubbles burst against your skin, they draw the blood toward the surface and create better circulation throughout your body. You can also use the various settings of an air bath to give yourself a very efficient lymphatic massage. Not all tubs are created equal, however, so do your research. If you opt for a manufacturer with a closed system, the hygienic benefits are substantial and will save you both money and time in the long run. Another benefit of this type of system is that you can add things like Epsom salts and essential oils to the water to rid yourself of toxins and further promote healing. Today, tubs can be customized in the placement of jets so that even those who have had hip replacement or similar surgeries can experience all of the benefits of hydrotherapy. This customization is also gaining popularity with sports figures because it offers the most beneficial therapy for their particular bodies.

Many tub manufacturers have begun to offer heated surfaces within the tubs themselves, similar to heating pads. A consumer has the option to place them in zones, such as the back and bottom. This is especially helpful for arthritis, and we are seeing an increase in demand for this feature as baby boomers begin to retire and build or renovate their "forever homes."
