COMING CLEAN

"I do all my sketching on planes," says Matthew Quinn of Design Galleria Kitchen and Bath Studio. "I can't really sit at my desk or sit at home and do it." The seasoned designer, who has been creating sinks and tubs as part of the **Matthew Quinn Collection** for MTI Baths for the past 10 years, just launched Continuum. "It's the latest collection of sinks that I've designed for them," he says. "I love stone and use a lot of expressive stone in my projects." But Quinn (a self-proclaimed minimalist) encourages consumers to personalize his items too. "You can make it your own and insert whatever you want in the little cutouts in the tubs—it could be metal, tile or wood. I provide the building blocks and let the designer express themselves through my products," says Quinn, who also released the Multiplicity collection (think orb legs, molding) with Art for Everyday. Work of Art

As an avid art collector and patron, it's only fitting that longtime Atlanta developer John Wieland is building a project he'd like to be remembered for in the heart of the city's cultural center. He's partnered with Mark Scogin Merrill Elam Architects and Brasfield & Gorrie to build the gated luxury condo residence **One Museum Place** at 1301 Peachtree St., across the street from the High Museum of Art and Woodruff Arts Center in Midtown. Work began late last year, and when it's completed in the first half of 2016, the project will feature 45 spacious two- and three-bedroom condos (up to 5,300 square feet, from \$900,000 to \$3.5 million) with special touches including enclosed, private parking spaces with elevators. Other amenities include an owner's lounge, fitness center, concierge and dog park. ompatlanta.com —*VVB*
