how to paint a doormat

Dress your porch in custom fashion—no special skills required. This project is as easy as tape, paint, and repeat.



Step One Set unpainted doormat on a flat surface protected with a drop cloth. Be sure the area is well-ventilated. Using 2-inch masking tape, create the first layer of grass designs. Press the tape down firmly to keep paint lines crisp.

Step Two Choose a hue of green (we started with the darkest of our three) and paint inside the "stencil" following manufacturer instructions. Let dry. Because the mat's fibers might absorb paint, you may need to add a second coat. Let dry. Remove tape.

Step Three Tape off the second layer of grass blades, varying the direction, curvature, and width to create dimension. Cover exposed areas with tape to protect from overspray. Paint a second shade of green, once again following manufacturer instructions. Let dry.

Repeat if necessary. Remove tape.

Step Four Determine the placement and design of the final blades of grass. Cover exposed areas with tape to protect from overspray. We chose our brightest shade for the final layer. Paint; let dry. Repeat if necessary. Remove tape.
