"Our clients want their bathrooms to feel like the luxurious spas they visit while on holiday," says Cathy Austin, a Southern Living Designer Network member based in Charlotte, North Carolina. "Soaking tubs have become works of art: larger, sculptural, and used as a focal point under artwork or overlooking a pretty view. Water closets are always included, usually his and hers. Vanities are similarly designed so everyone has their own space."
