

#### **Room for All**

ONE BATHROOM CAN SERVE THE WHOLE FAMILY IN STYLE

Not every home has multiple baths, so a single bathroom must be designed to meet the needs of all who use it. Here are some tips to help make it work beautifully.

ABOVE: Multiple mirrors or one big one spanning a vanity wall will ease the morning rush by allowing several people to get ready for their day at one time. A swing-arm magnifying mirror offers even more flexibility.

>>layout Two sinks is a must in a shared family bathroom. An expansive countertop will leave lots of room for grooming essentials (especially important if your family includes teenagers). Vanities with lots of drawers, a large tub and a separate shower or a traditional tub/shower combo works well for most families. "Identify specific zones," says Rob Whitten of Whitten Architects, Portland, Maine, who designed this bathroom with his colleague, designer Leah Muliero. "Create a zone for mirror, sinks and medicine chests, a toilet area, shower area and tub area."

RIGHT: A separate water closet for the toilet, plus tub, shower and vanity areas, allow more people to use the room at one time. A niche in a shower tidies up a heavy-use space; a showerhead on a sliding bar can be adjusted for various heights.

BELOW RIGHT: Multiple lighting options, including downlights, pendants, sconces and natural light, let one person apply makeup while another takes a bath.



>>storage Skip the towel bar in favor of space-saving hooks—one for each family member. Be sure to install some low enough for kids to reach. Use bins and baskets to corral everything from toys to toiletries. "We designed a common shared space in the middle of this vanity, which is flanked by four drawers and two cabinets," explains Muliero. Perfect for two adults and two kids!

>>finishes "Durability is key," says Whitten. He chose Carrara marble counters, glass tiles, nickel-plated fixtures and a ceramic toilet to hold up under heavy use. Painted wood boarding on the walls instead of plaster or drywall allows the surfaces to take a beating.

>>color When selecting tile, choose neutral tones to make the bathroom feel larger (this will also give you a canvas to accessorize with colorful accents as your family's tastes change). The team used Benjamin Moore's Sea Salt paint color on the walls, white glass tiles behind the sinks and a light-hued Carrara marble on the counter and on the shower walls. "It's very classic," says Whitten. "And it will still be in style in 25 or even 50 years."



## Bigger & Better

A kitchen that's bursting at the seams gets a revamp as a larger, more functional space

Designer Erinn Valencich, owner of Erinn V Design Group of Los Angeles, spends her days helping clients create beautiful rooms and plan perfect partiesbut hosting people in her own galley-style kitchen was not so easy. "I entertain a lot," she says, "but the kitchen before was claustrophobic and didn't have a good flow." To create a better layout that included more counter space and a spot for casual meals, Valencich started by combining the existing room with an adjacent back porch, bumping the space from 150 square feet to a more user-friendly 300 square feet. A mix of cabinet styles, including contemporary square doors painted white near the windows and espresso-stained cabinets





throughout, gives the kitchen a modern look. Frosty white CaesarStone counters make the kitchen extrabright and happy. "They're virtually indestructible, so easy and stress-free to use," says Valencich. The room's soothing color comes from the brushed-look gray/blue porcelain tile floor and the watery blue glass tile backsplash. As a little splurge, she used more expensive blue, brown and gray glass tiles sparingly to create a border behind the range and add an accent to the breakfast bar area. Valencich is pleased with her results: "Having a kitchen you enjoy using changes everything!"

before the renovation, the galley-style kitchen had a south-of-the-border feel with orange and yellow accents and faux-finished cabinets. "The refrigerator was on the back porch and the stove faced into the hallway, so the layout was a challenge for entertaining," says Valencich.



#### in the details

>>breakfast bar "I wanted a place for breakfast in the kitchen but also somewhere to entertain," Valencich explains. A center island would have blocked traffic flow and taken up floor space, so she tucked a breakfast bar into one side of the kitchen instead. The bar's design, inspired by a classic Parsons table, accommodates two metal stools that slide under the counter for seating. When visitors come, the breakfast bar doubles as a party station.

>>lighting Upgrading the kitchen's lighting scheme was important to Valencich, for both function and beauty. Extra recessed lights and under-cabinet lights illuminate the space at night and make the glass-tile backsplash sparkle. All of the lights—including a hanging pendant over the sink—are on dimmers for flexibility and energy efficiency.

>>upgraded window Valencich replaced the aging window over the sink for one with better ventilation. "The old kitchen had a funky garden window that looked dated and didn't let fresh air into the kitchen," she says. The new white-painted vinyl slider with beveled glass "adds an elegant touch" while pulling more air into the room.

# Under the Eaves

An unused attic became the perfect spot to create a sumptuous master bathroom

No strangers to remodeling, Izzy Semrau and her husband, Mike, knew it would be possible to create an inviting master bath in the attic of their Atlanta Craftsman-style bungalow. "When we purchased the house, there was no upstairs," says Izzy. Their wish list: a shower large enough for two, a separate alcove for a

deep soaking tub, and a vanity with two sinks. To help them reach their goals, Izzy and Mike teamed with designer Lisa Grisham of the Atlanta-based firm Home ReBuilders. The final scheme includes an open vanity with a richly patterned marble called Emperador Dark that was used for both the countertop and backsplash. It's topped with two white vessel sinks and a pair of oval mirrors in a dark bronze finish. An open shelf belowalong with built-in niches and two medicine cabinets by each sinkoffers easy-access storage. "I like the openness of the vanity," says Izzy. "I don't like to wonder what's in the cupboard." A deep soaking tub surrounded by windows has a faucet and hardware with an English bronze finish that has a stately appeal. "The position of the bathtub creates a strong focal point when you enter the space," says Grisham.



The bathroom's oversize shower is fitted with earth-toned limestone tiles, dual rain showerheads, glass doors and a handy acrylic chair. The floor features the same limestone tiles in a smaller size, laid diagonally for visual interest. Other final details—like the rich dark wood floor with a low-luster seal—give this shared space personality without sacrificing comfort. "We created a room with a clean, simple feel that's cozy and can be used by two people at once," says Izzy.

#### in the details

- >>curtains Though sheers were added over the windows, Izzy decided to use heavy cotton/linen white curtains with white fringe tiebacks to separate the tub alcove from the rest of the bath. "The curtains make the tub area its own room, so to speak," says Izzy. "They make that whole area feel less cold."
- >>lighting An elegant chandelier brings a surprising element to the space, juxtaposed with more contemporary fixtures used over the two sinks for task lighting. "I think lighting is a component of design a lot of people overlook, but it can make a huge difference in a room—it can take it from being just kind of nice to something special," says Grisham.
- >>wall color Sherwin-Williams' Chateau Brown paint was chosen for the bathroom walls, inspired by the background of a wallpaper used in the adjacent master bedroom. "The rich chocolate brown is soothing and warm, but it's also a vibrant color that has some life to it," says Izzy. Contrasting white trim accentuates the architectural detailing in the room.
