

AUDIO-INSPIRED SHOWER FIXTURES

With design cues clearly taken from vintage stereo components, the Hi-Fi collection of thermostatic shower mixers from Italian manufacturer Gessi is a unique departure from more typical bathroom fixtures. Intuitive graphical markings make setting the shower a simple task, and the wide buttons and dials are designed as much for ergonomics as they are for a pleasant tactile experience. The mixers come in three varieties: flush-mounted square, flush-mounted rectangle, or a shallow shelf version that provides a convenient spot for shampoo and other bathing sundries. The Hi-Fi collection also includes matching wands, jets, and showerheads, all sharply styled to match the stereophonic theme. The shower mixers come in 12 handsome finishes and start at \$2500. —Rob Wotzak, digital brand manager

ELEGANTLY SIMPLE ILLUMINATION

With its gently curving shade and frosted-glass diffuser projecting a wide, soft radiance, the A1965 pendant by 20th-century Finnish lighting designer Paavo Tynell is a prime example of form following function. The spun-metal shade is dappled with tiny perforations, letting just enough light through to add a bit of sparkle to any room. Just over 18 in. in diameter, the lamp's shade is available in several colors of painted aluminum or in Tynell's signature material-polished brass. The adjustable-height A1965 pendant includes a sleek brass counterweight, while the simpler 1965 variant hangs from a fixed cord. Prices range from \$745 for a painted fixed pendant to \$1545 for the brass

adjustable version. -R.W.







VIBRANT KITCHEN FAUCET

If you want to add a whimsical touch to liven up your kitchen, the Tanz faucet from Isenberg might be just what you're looking for. With its flanged 90° elbows and straight lines, the Tanz gives a nod to industrial-style fixtures without being overbearing. If you're really feeling daring, you can skip the plain stainless steel and go for the ceramic finish in one of 20 colors, ranging from a bold gloss black to a vibrant crimson. A single side lever keeps things simple, and the faucet comes with a compact matching spray handle. Price ranges from \$650 to \$830 depending on finish. —R.W.

SVELTE COOKER

Monogram's Minimalist Collection of wall ovens truly lives up to its name with its extremely slender stainless-steel frames and unadorned black-glass panels. There's no need for knobs or buttons because each oven is controlled by a color touch screen that disappears when not in use. Behind the simple facade is a feature-packed appliance ready to tackle all of your baking needs. WiFi connectivity allows you to control everything from the Monogram app, so you can keep tabs on a cake from the comfort of your living room or preheat the oven on your way home after a busy day at work. A scan-to-cook mode lets you scan barcodes on packaged foods to send cooking instructions to the device. The convection models include an air-fry mode, allowing health-conscious cooks to get the crispy food they love without the fat. The wall ovens are available in single (\$3200) and double (\$4500) configurations, in 27-in. or 30-in. widths. -R.W.
